SCHOLARSHIPS

Our fundraising efforts and the generosity of our community have made it possible for us to offer scholarships. We will be providing three types of scholarships.

(1) Need-based Scholarships: these scholarships are intended to help families who are trying to meet their basic needs - housing, food, transportation, childcare, etc... We know how stressful it is to be in these situations and we want to help lessen the burden while we help connect you with community resources.

(2) Learning Opportunity Scholarships: our children grow and develop as they are exposed to different opportunities and have access to resources to support their learning. These scholarships are intended to help our children access learning opportunities such as attending a class or workshop, going to a camp, or accessing tutoring.

(3) Graduation Scholarships: we want to acknowledge that hard work and achievement of our Hispanic/Latino/Latina/Latinx seniors by awarding them with scholarships to help them start their next journey.

Cecilia (Cecy) Plaza

It is my pleasure to introduce Cecilia (Cecy) Plaza to our community. Cecy is the mother of three beautiful, intelligent, curious, funny, active children: Leo age 12 in 6th grade at AMS, Alex age 9 in 4th grade at Cornell and Isabella age 5 in K at Cornell. They are wonderful active children and they all take piano, swimming classes, and are enrolled in cub scouts. Leo does basketball, Alex soccer, Isabella dance. In addition, they have all helped Cecy in her daycare.

Cecy went down many paths before owning her own daycare. After graduating from Albany High School, she attended CA

Culinary Academy in San Francisco. This led to her doing her externship in Florence, Italy where she met and fell in love with her husband Dany. She also discovered that she didn't want to be a chef. She shifted plans and attended Cosmetology/Esthetician school in Italy. She ended up working at a spa there for 6 years, which she loved. At that time, she decided it was time to come home, and so she moved back to the Bay area. She worked two jobs in the restaurant industry; at Skates on the Bay and for Francis Ford Coppola as a manager in his restaurants. Although she loved the restaurant industry (just not the kitchen), when she became pregnant with her first son (Leo), she realized it no longer fit her lifestyle.

As she toured various daycares for her son, she wasn't convinced that he would get the education she wanted him to get. So she decided to open a small in home daycare. She started with 4 children and went back to college. She quickly realized that working with children was her calling and she expanded to a large in-home daycare (for 14 children), which she has owned for 12 years now. During that time she also achieved her Associate Teacher's Permit and an AA in Early Childhood Education. She is now a successful CEO of Tiny Footprints Child Care. Cecy's advice to youth is to "never say never;" it is never too late to change career paths.

Despite Cecy's busy job, she has participated in many Familias Latinas' events including Cornell's Got Talent's performance. Cecy's parents are from Argentina and Peru, and Cecy was born in Oakland, CA. Growing up in this area and having gone through the Albany School District, Cecy did not see many Latinos. Cecy was so excited to join Familias Latinas de Albany so she could be a part of a community. She loves being able to share different cultural experiences with her children. It also just feels nice to be part of a group that feels like an extended family; people you can rely on if you need help, if you have questions, if you just need someone to talk to.

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Latinas in STEM

For hundreds of years, Latinos have contributed to the STEM field Unfortunately, Latinos especially Latinas, are underrepresented in the field. In 2021 Hispanics comprised 17% of the workforce but only 8% of STEM jobs (Pew, 2021). This disparity is seen in the classroom as well, where Hispanic girls are less likely than Hispanic boys to like STEM subjects (81% vs. 91%) or aspire to STEM careers (28% vs 64%) (Student Research Foundation, 2020). There are many contributing factors to these statistics, some are, implicit bias that impacts confidence level in students, socioeconomic status, and the impacts of underrepresentation.

This month we honor the Latinas in STEM. These women stand on the shoulders of the women who came before them while simultaneously paving the way for more Latinas in STEM.

Yes, you heard that right. In 2008 Angela helped changed the way we communicate and was only an intern at Apple when she undertook the project.
